

Pupil premium 2020-2021

The Pupil Premium grant is a Government initiative that targets extra funding at students from deprived backgrounds. The grant is intended to help disadvantaged students to "close the gap" and to raise attainment and improve progress.

Children who are eligible include:

- Students who are registered for Free School Meals (FSM) in the last six years
- Children who have been looked after continuously for more than 6 months
- Children of armed service personnel.

Parayhouse School recognises that not all students who receive free school meals are disadvantaged, and that some students who are disadvantaged/vulnerable do not qualify for free school meals. We therefore allocate Pupil Premium funding to support any student or groups of students who are vulnerable or who are identified as a priority by the school's tracking processes and pastoral systems.

We provide an educational environment where students can develop their language and communication and social and emotional skills, knowledge and understanding, working towards reaching their individual potential through use of a multi-disciplinary team.

Some examples of use of funding:

- particular computer software or extra materials for specific courses
- help with trips and transport
- specific and targeted therapy input
- Breakfast club

For 2020/2021 the School is expected to receive £30,075 in Pupil Premium, in respect of 27 students. £1,349 carried forward from 2019-2020
