# SoSafe! At Parayhouse School

At Parayhouse, we know that all of our children are vulnerable and endeavour to build their understanding and awareness of how to keep themselves safe at all times.

SoSafe! provides a set of conceptual tools designed to promote social safety through:

- 1. The provision of a simplified and 'rule-governed' model of social reality
- 2. Teaching the type and degree of verbal and physical intimacy appropriate with different categories of people
- 3. Teaching strategies for moving into intimate relationships in a safe and measured manner
- 4. Providing visual communication tools for reporting physical or sexual abuse
- 5. Facilitating and maintaining support networks

# Why are we using SoSAFE?

- Aimed at students with intellectual disability
- Our students have difficulty retaining learnt information so require a concrete visual reference
- Provides 'black and white' framework of what is OK/not OK which can be built on for more cognitively able students
- Teach students it is OK to say 'no' to adults
- Gradually phasing adult prompts to step towards independence



## Tool #2 - People and Relationships








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




## Tool #3 - Steps to Relationships

#### How do we teach it?

- Systematic teaching of symbol discrimination
  - Students need to learn what the symbols mean and differences between similar symbols





## Teaching Sequence

Follow teaching sequence of concepts

#### Stage 1:

1.A Private and Public Parts of the Body

1.B Private and Public Places / Private Things (behaviours)

etc...

Teaching scripts and teaching ideas are provided for each step

\*2x 20-30min structured teaching sessions per week

...plus

\*Incidental 'teachable moments'

## Scripted Definitions:

**Every concept within SoSafe! Has an associated script to teach learners.** 

#### Here are some examples:

- Friend "A friend is someone I know, like and help"
- **OK Helper -** "When I am scared, sad or need help, I can ask my OK helper"
- Consent "Consent means I ask, you say yes. You ask, I say yes"

### How we are going to embed it through school:

• Use practical, meaningful, functional teaching activities and capitalise on 'teachable moments'

e.g.

- Help page encourage students to report incidents in playground
- Talk Touch triangle correct errors in labelling of relationships (e.g. student calling a teacher their boyfriend)
- Embedding concepts e.g. student hugs visitor (someone I 'don't know')
